Background

The Department of HCRD was established according to the structure and mission of reforming the faculty of Education, Kasetsart University where developed by Department of occupational education complying with the resolution of Kasertsart University Council on 17 September 2007.

The development could be sequenced as follows;

The Department of occupational education at KPS campus used to be the unit of Bangkhen Campus that started by moving the third and fourth-year students (i.e. junior and senior students) of Agriculture Education Program from Bangkhen Campus to study at KPS Campus in 1979.

In 1986 – 1987, the second-year students (i.e. sophomores) of Agricultural Education Program were moved to study at KPS Campus, after that the first year students (i.e. freshmen) were recruited particularly for extra quota to study at KPS Campus in 1990 – 1991. Later, all first-year students of Agricultural Education Program were started at the KPS Campus in 1993 – 1994.

In 2001 - 2002, Starting a new bachelor's degree program in Agricultural and Environmental Education. Subsequently, in 2004 - 2005, the Bachelor of Education program in Agricultural Science was started according to the policy of teacher production with 5 years program.

On 23 November 2004, the University Council declared an establishment of the faculty of education in KPS Campus where the occupational education program was included as a unit beneath the faculty.

In 2006, two new programs were approved from the university council, which consisted of the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and Environment, and the Doctor of Philosophy in Human and Community Resource Development. These two programs were started the class in 2007.

In 2008, the Bachelor of Education Program (Knowledge Management), a major of Agricultural and Environmental Education, was started for admission.

In 2008, the Master of Art in Human and Community Resource Development program was approved from the university council which the higher education commission accepted and approved on 11 November 2008, and therefore started the class in 2009 accordingly.

Program duration

Type 1.1 Program is a 3-year research program offered to Master graduates with the following qualifications.

- Research experience or at least 2 years work experience in the area of human and community resource development or other related areas,
- At least 1 published article in a recognized academic journal,
- The result of an English proficiency Test as required by the Higher Education Commission,
- Additional qualifications as required by KU Regulation on Graduate Studies at KU.,

Type 2.1 Program is offered to Master graduates with the duration of 3 years for completion including 3 semesters for coursework and 3 semesters for thesis research.

Type 2.2 Program is offered to 1st Class Honor's Bachelor graduates with the duration of 5 years for completion including 6 semesters for coursework and 4 semesters for thesis research.
